

**Regulation Adopted by Vote of the Faculty of the Harvard Law School on  
May 12, 1959, with regard to Disposition of Third Year Written Work  
Papers**

The following regulation applies to papers, received by the Harvard Law Library pursuant to the resolution of the Faculty adopted on April 14, 1959, which have been submitted in satisfaction of the third year written work requirement, the written work requirements for the degree of LL.M., or the requirements of any seminar, except that it does not apply to a seminar paper submitted by a candidate for the degree of S.J.D. which the candidate proposes to use thereafter as part of his dissertation.

1. The physical manuscript thus deposited shall become the property of the Harvard Law Library. The Library shall be free to make the manuscript available to readers, and may take any steps which in its opinion are appropriate to that end. For example, it may make interlibrary loans of the manuscript, and it may make or permit others to make single photocopies of the manuscript or parts thereof.
2. Subject to the terms of this regulation, all literary rights in the manuscript are reserved to the author. Accordingly the author shall be free to publish the manuscript and to take steps to secure statutory copyright therein.
3. The Library shall overstamp the manuscript, and any copies of the manuscript or parts thereof made by it, with (a) a reference to this regulation and to the reservation of literary rights to the author, and (b) a statement that short extracts may be quoted or paraphrased if the source is acknowledged, but that more extensive quotation or paraphrase is prohibited unless the author's consent is obtained in advance. The Library shall require others whom it authorizes to make copies of the manuscript or parts thereof to overstamp such copies with a similar legend.
