

## Alternate Format Copyright Notice and User Agreement

Copyrighted text may be converted into an electronic format as a disability or medically-related accommodation. Alternate format text may not be reproduced or distributed in a format other than for use exclusively by the student receiving the accommodation. Any unauthorized use or reproduction of alternate format materials will make the student subject to disciplinary action through the Harvard Law School Administrative Board.

### User Agreement

1. The student must currently be registered for a class at Harvard Law School or Harvard Law School Affiliate Program.
2. The student must be approved for alternate format texts and class materials through Harvard Law School Accessibility Services.
3. The student may seek materials from specialized resources prior to requesting alternate format from HLS Accessibility Services (Learning Ally, bookshare.org, etc.).
4. The student must purchase books and ensure that they are in new condition.
5. The student must provide HLS Accessibility Services proof of purchase of the textbooks before it can be converted into an alternate format.
6. The student should complete the Alternate Format Request form as soon as possible. Ideally, the request should be made 4-6 weeks from the date the materials are needed.
7. The student cannot copy or reproduce any of the alternate format texts. Alternate format texts are for the sole use of the student requesting it.
