

Lactation Room Support System

WHAT IS A LACTATION ROOM:

A lactation room is a dedicated space for nursing parents to express (pump) breastmilk and/or to nurse their babies. They are exclusively for this purpose. All campus lactation rooms have a Medela Symphony hospital-grade pump provided; to use it you need your own <u>Medela accessory kit</u> or you can bring your own personal pump.

WHERE ARE LACTATION ROOMS?

Harvard University has a network of over 50 rooms across three campuses (see <u>lactation map</u> and <u>room list</u>).

REGISTRATION: HOW DO I GET ACCESS TO THE LACTATION ROOM?

All nursing parents must pre-register as either a HUID holder or a visitor.

- Active HUID card holders: Upon registration, you will be given access to the entire system of lactation rooms, campus wide. You will receive emailed instructions for how to reserve a room (through a closed RoomBook template) and how to locate, gain access, and get room-specific information.
- Campus Visitors: Once registered, you will be contacted to determine the best lactation room available for your visit.

RESERVATIONS: WHEN CAN I USE A LACTATION ROOM?

Once registered, HUID holders can use FAS RoomBook to locate a room and to see the entire system's availability. If you need an FAS RoomBook account, one will be created for you and the private Lactation Room Template included; if you already have an account, the private Lactation Room Template will be added.

- Some lactation rooms are **reservation-only**. These must be reserved through FAS RoomBook:
 - o Once registered, you will receive emailed instructions. You can make reservations for specific rooms and time slots, for any room campus wide.
 - o Time slots are 30 minutes. You can make recurring reservations for up to 3 months.
- Some lactation rooms are drop-in.
 - o Once registered, you will be able to see which rooms are drop-in spaces. These are not reservable, and you must simply knock before entering. It is first-come, first-serve.

ACCESS: HOW DO I GET INSIDE A LACTATION ROOM?

FAS RoomBook contains the access information to each room:

- HUID card tap: door card readers are located on about 30% of campus lactation rooms.
 - Upon registration your HUID will be granted access to rooms that require card access.
 - o This will expire in 6 months but can be renewed for additional 6-month increments.
 - o Door, stairwell and any other needed clearances for access will also be granted.
- Pinlock: some doors require pincodes, which can be found in the FAS RoomBook listing.
- Open door: these rooms are open and have an internal lock for privacy and security when in use.
